### Remarks of Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori to the Special Convention of The Episcopal Church in South Carolina January 26, 2013

Last summer, not too far from here, someone got excited and called the police about a plane flying near a nuclear power plant. It was a glider — an unpowered plane with a human pilot — more substantial than a hang-glider, and definitely not a drone. It seems a local citizen thought this plane was flying too low and too near the power plant. Gliders don't have engines, and they depend on air currents and updrafts to stay aloft. The pilot had made one turn near the power plant, which would be a likely source of rising warm air.

Well, the pilot had gained enough altitude to turn for home when he heard somebody on the radio asking about an airplane near his position. He responded, saying basically, "that's me," and the person on the radio told him, in an embarrassed tone, that the local police wanted him to land. He landed at the Hartsville airport to discover a dozen police cars waiting for him. The local constabulary insisted that he had been flying in a no-fly zone. The pilot got out his charts and showed the officer that there was no such thing indicated on his chart. The officer arrested him, handcuffed him, and took him to jail. He was not permitted to phone the business from which he'd rented the glider that morning. They'd begun to worry, because he was well overdue. Eventually the plane's owner heard from the FBI and Homeland Security that the pilot was in jail, for "breach of peace." The Darlington County police kept this 70 year old man in jail for more than 24 hours, in a tiny cell with a dozen others, with no more than a dirty blanket. He was released on bond a day later, and the charges were eventually dismissed, but he has yet to get any apology. The FAA is pretty upset, and so is Congress. Local police don't have jurisdiction over airspace, and neither does the FBI or Homeland Security. These cops were flat out wrong.

I tell you that story because it's indicative of attitudes we've seen here and in many other places. Somebody decides he knows the law, and oversteps whatever authority he may have to dictate the fate of others who may in fact be obeying the law, and often a law for which this local tyrant is not the judge. It's not too far from that kind of attitude to citizens' militias deciding to patrol their towns or the Mexican border for unwelcome visitors. It's not terribly far from the state of mind evidenced in school shootings, or in those who want to arm school children, or the terrorism that takes oil workers hostage.

Most human communities, from churches to governments to families, function more effectively in response to shared decision-making. Most of us don't live in a world where one person is the ultimate Decider — because, over and over again, we've discovered that better decisions are made when they're made in communities with appropriate checks and balances. Power assumed by one authority figure alone is often a recipe for abuse, tyranny, and corruption. That's why Jesus challenges us to think about how the shepherd acts. The authentic ones don't sneak over the wall in the dead of night. They operate transparently, and they work cooperatively with the gate-keeper himself.

Today is the feast day for Timothy, Titus, and Silas. They were early disciples of the Jesus movement, and they offer a constructive example of the same issues. The early Christian community has been wrestling with what it means to be a faithful follower of the law as a Gentile – how much of the Jewish law applies to these new followers of Jesus? Paul and Barnabas set out to visit Antioch, sent by the group of leaders in Jerusalem, who have chosen Silas and a couple of others to go with them. They take a letter from the council with them says, "we know you've

heard rumors about us and our decision-making, so we're sending these people to share with you what has actually been decided. We think you'll discover that the rumors aren't as extreme as the reality. We're not increasing your burdens, we're trying to simplify them." The council has decided in a minimalist way – circumcision is not required, nor must the gentiles follow all the dietary laws. Just a few things: don't eat food that's been blessed in pagan rites, and don't eat meat from strangled animals or that still has blood in it. But the struggle continued over whether that was adequate observance.

It's the kind of question that we will never hear the end of, for the challenges of human communities continue to evolve – because God's creative spirit continues to draw us on toward the fullness of the reign of God. We're not there yet, and that means change will continue until the end of all things. You heard Isaiah's prophetic words, "former things have come and gone; I (God) am doing a new thing." In a very real sense, we cannot remain faithful and refuse to wrestle with change. It doesn't mean blind accommodation to developments around us. It does mean discernment in community about the direction we believe God is leading.

Well, before very long Paul and Barnabas split up, after a fight about whether or not to take John Mark with them. Paul was angry that Mark had left them when they were in Perga and gone back to Jerusalem. There's no account of the split between Paul and Barnabas ever being healed. Being right may feel good for a moment, but the consequences often last a long time. Nor was Paul always consistent. He soon decides that Timothy must be circumcised, in spite of the Jerusalem decision, because his mother's Jewish.

The hard questions aren't usually decided immediately or by individuals, but by entire communities struggling through the difficult implications and the normal human resistance to change. The community wrestles and after a while finds itself in a new place, still in faithful relationship to God, whether they're in Egypt, wandering in the wilderness, in Judah and Israel, Babylon, or South Carolina.

The question is less about who's right and who's wrong in the midst of the current controversies. It's more about how we deal with those who disagree – the other sheep in the flock, and the variety of shepherds around us. Are we going to be good shepherds, partnering for abundant life? The saints we remember today didn't do it perfectly either. They wrestled with the questions, came to varying conclusions, and kept on wrestling. Luke's account is a pretty honest tale about their differences. Eventually, sometimes years or even centuries later, the community came to some consensus about food rules and circumcision. We're still struggling over other issues, like whose voice is authoritative and where and with whom true love may be found.

Let's go back to the pilot and the cops for a minute. The situation escalated when the local law enforcement who thought they were right failed to consult. They made a bad decision and then couldn't or wouldn't back down or try to rectify it until the whole thing had become patently absurd. I am immensely grateful that one officer didn't follow through on his first threat, which was to shoot the glider down.

What are those of you in this Diocese going to do in your interactions with those who've departed? Are they law-breakers who should be shot down or thrown in jail? Do we see them as vigilantes? Neither is going to produce more abundant life, my friends. When you meet them out there in the pasture, consider that some of the sheep may think they're listening to the voice of the Good Shepherd. Some are also simply exhausted.

What about the sheep who aren't in the fold, who don't know there is a feast to be found, rest for the body and soul, and partners who are willing to wrestle with the dictates of petty Deciders or wolves who masquerade as sheep? We all have a responsibility to be shepherds, to help others find their way through the Gate of abundant life. And believe

me, that world out there is filled with hungry, lost sheep. Your experience of abundant life here has something to do with finding them.

We share a responsibility for all the sheep, to safeguard their lives and pastures, but it doesn't give us carte blanche to shoot potentially errant ones out of the sky. Angry responses to trespassing often produce that kind of response. God's feast doesn't need "keep out" signs — the picnic on the grass is open to all who are hungry, who need rest, who seek peace and justice and healing.

The sheriff was right about a breach of peace, but wrong about who instigated it. Our task is to heal the breach, particularly with those who are seeking rest and a feast. The banquet table is spread with abundance for all, even though it's hard to join the feast if you're busy controlling the gate. The Gate himself has already done that work, and the word is out, "y'all come! Come to the feast!"

Remarks of Bishop vonRosenberg to Special Convention January 26, 2013

#### Thanks

First of all, on behalf of the diocese gathered here, I want to express heart-felt thanks to our Presiding Bishop. For your presence with us, for your gracious leadership, and for your support of us in South Carolina, we give thanks to you and to God. Thank you, so very much!

In addition, I want to thank those who have worked so hard in preparation for this day. The Steering Committee for the Reorganization of this diocese – convened by Tom Tisdale and chaired by Hillery Douglas – have done great work. I am very grateful also to the clergy, the staff, and parishioners of Grace Episcopal Church, who have labored tirelessly over details in order to provide us with a wonderful setting for this convention.

And, I want to pay special recognition to those faithful Episcopalians – clergy and laity -throughout the diocese, who have struggled and persevered to claim their heritage, often in unlikely and less-than-ideal circumstances. Job well done! As we all know, there is much more work to do.

Also, I want to express my thanks to the delegates of this convention, for the honor and the trust you have given me. As I have said in public interviews recently, The Episcopal Church has been my home and Episcopalians have been my spiritual family for all of my life. Therefore, I feel a dual sense of gratitude and of responsibility as I accept the honor and the trust that you convey to me this day. We have quite a task ahead of us — but with the support of each other and by the grace of God, we will be successful. May God grant us the wisdom, the perseverance, and the grace necessary to accomplish His will in this diocese and at this time.

Last, but certainly not least, I want to say a special thank you to my partner in life and in ministry, Annie vonRosenberg.

#### Introduction

Some of you may have heard previously of a comment I made to Annie prior to our move to South Carolina. It seems appropriate to mention it again here. As we were packing to leave East Tennessee a year and a half ago, I said, "All of the moves we've made in our married life have been because of the church. But this move will be in spite of the church!" That comment seems at least ironic in the present moment — and perhaps even prophetic, in a strange and contradictory kind of way.

In any event, here we are — a group of people committed to The Episcopal Church — some, sadly displaced from their spiritual homes; others, finding new life in exciting times; and a bishop who thought he had retired. Indeed, here we are — facing an uncertain future; relying on others for strength and support; and depending on God's grace in the tomorrows that await. It sounds almost like New Testament Christianity, doesn't it?

In my remarks today, I want to use the image of rebuilding, for that is what we are called to do – to reorganize and to rebuild The Episcopal Church in South Carolina. I have several building blocks to suggest to you. There are and will be others, certainly. This is not an exhaustive list, but it mentions a few, at least. However, before considering building blocks, we need first to think about the foundation on which we are to build.

#### Foundation

St. Paul wrote to the people of the church in Corinth, "No one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ" (I Cor 3:11). And those words of St. Paul we must remember in our day

and in this diocese. Jesus Christ is our foundation. On that firm foundation we must rebuild. In particular, two Christly virtues for our foundation in South Carolina are these: humility and love.

All of us who claim to be followers of Jesus Christ have good reason to seek God's forgiveness for our failure to achieve Christian unity in our time. Before our Lord was arrested, he prayed for the unity of those who would follow him. St. John records these prayerful words of our Lord – about his followers and addressed to God the Father: "I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one" (17:20-21). We do indeed – all of us – have good reason to seek God's forgiveness for our failure to live into our Lord's prayerful wish – his dream for Christian unity.

The history of the church, though, contains a record of many others who share in this failure. We are not unique in our current circumstances. The apostles split before Jesus died. And such splitting has continued throughout history. The existence of denominations testifies to the failure of our efforts on behalf of Christian unity. And the current situation in South Carolina is further evidence of the same. Therefore, Christian humility needs to have a place in the foundation on which we are rebuilding. There is no place for self righteousness here ... but there is much room for humility. May we, therefore, claim the Christian virtue of humility as an important part of our foundation.

In addition, as followers of Jesus, we need to recognize that other sincere Christians – former Episcopalians – have chosen a different path from ours. Theirs is a path committed to faith in Jesus, as they understand that faith. Thus, our intentions, in many ways, mirror each other, even though our paths diverge at this point in history.

Therefore, it is appropriate to pray for one another and to wish each other well on our separate ways. While we have failed thus far in our efforts toward Christian unity, our Lord will ultimately succeed, on his day. When that day comes, I want to greet fellow Christians as friends, not as enemies. Thus, in the meantime – before our Lord's return – the appropriate attitude toward fellow Christians on a different path is love. May love, therefore, provide another essential ingredient in the foundation on which we build.

#### **Building Blocks**

Now, let me turn our attention to several building blocks, to place on the foundation of humility and love. As I mentioned earlier, this is not an exhaustive list, but these at least will give us cornerstones for the work to come. First, we are not alone. We are part of The Episcopal Church ... and, through The Episcopal Church, we are part of the world-wide Anglican Communion. Indeed, the one recognized, participating member of the Anglican Communion in the United States is The Episcopal Church. In South Carolina, we have a particular mission and ministry in this part of God's kingdom But we are not alone. We are not independent. We make no claim of sovereignty. We are part of something much bigger than ourselves - the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church of our Lord. We are accountable, therefore. And, we thank God for our union with others in Christ. Secondly, the tent which is The Episcopal Church is wide and broad. All may seek shelter under this tent. If I may mix metaphors for a moment, the tent actually covers a family ... a very extended family. That is, under this tent, not everyone agrees on much of anything - like in a big family. We are not under the tent because we are likeminded or because we agree on everything ... but because we are a family. With all of its diversity recognized and embraced under this tent, we thank God for our family of The Episcopal Church! Thirdly, as we rebuild this diocese, we also will reclaim classic Anglican, Episcopal theology. This cornerstone offers access to a rich heritage, which we need so very much. For instance, sources of authority - from the beginnings of Anglicanism - have included scripture, tradition, and reason. Protestant denominations who hold only

Anglicans, representing the Anglican Communion in this part of the world. Therefore, in addition to holy scripture, the traditions of the church through history and our God-given reason also possess authority for us. We give thanks for such classic Anglican, Episcopal theology, which we will reclaim, even as we rebuild this diocese.

A fourth and final cornerstone may be most important of all — and that is an emphasis on mission. The Episcopal Church actually has another legal name — "The Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society." Therefore, this cornerstone identifies who we really are. In this time of rebuilding for us in South Carolina, the temptation will be great to focus too much attention on ourselves. But, ironically, an excess of such attention would be over against our very identity. It was Archbishop William Temple who wrote, "The church is the only society on earth that exists for

mission.

By way of conclusion, then, we have a lot of work to do in the task of rebuilding The Episcopal Church in South Carolina. However, we have resources – both within this diocese and beyond it – to help us in the tasks ahead. I have suggested a couple of ingredients in a secure foundation on which we may build. And, I have offered four building blocks – cornerstones on which to build.

"I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe." Gay Jennings
Comments to Special Convention
January 26, 2013

My name is Gay Jennings and I am an Episcopalian. And I thank God you are too. My mother used to say that the only person who likes change is a wet baby. Change has been forced upon you, and I am here to tell you that the House of Deputies and the entire Church are covering you with prayer as you renew, reorganize, reorder, refresh, reconstitute, and indeed, resurrect the Episcopal Church in South Carolina.

Today, as you've heard from the Presiding Bishop, is the commemoration of Timothy, Titus and Silas, to whom Paul entrusted the work of building up the church. It's an apt feast day for this convention.

Tomorrow's commemoration of Lydia, Dorcas and Phoebe is equally apt. They were three devout women who also helped build the early church. We don't know much about them since they were disciples at a time when women's work went largely unrecorded. Lydia, we know, was a prosperous cloth merchant whose house served as a base of operations for Paul, Timothy, and their companions. Phoebe was likely the patroness of the early church in Corinth, and Dorcas devoted herself to works of charity in Joppa.

Lydia, Dorcas and Phoebe served God with the gifts they had been given. The collect for their commemoration asks God to "Inspire us today to build up your Church with our gifts in hospitality, charity and bold witness to the Gospel of Christ."

Like in the early church, you faithful Episcopalians in South Carolina will need everyone's gifts to create a new church for a new time. Some of you are the heirs of Lydia, Dorcas and Phoebe and serve God by providing hospitality, charity and witness. Others of you will witness to the Gospel or are already by feeding the hungry, healing the sick, and proclaiming justice for the oppressed. Still others of you will be elected today to serve in governance. Some of you will, when the election is called, be elected as deputies to General Convention, and offer your gifts to the church.

Whatever our gifts, Episcopalians are bound by the Baptismal Covenant, which is the foundational expression of our Episcopal identity. We are all ministers of the gospel by virtue of our baptism. It is our first and most important ordination for ministry.

When I wrote to you last month, I suggested that you take heart especially in our baptismal promise to seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbor as ourselves. As your Provisional Bishop noted, there are times ahead when that will be a hard promise to keep, —when it may seem as if the great breadth of conviction, experience and practice among Episcopalians threatens to overwhelm your longing for unity and clarity. But if you look around this historic convention, and you remember the communion of saints that has gone before you, I hope you will be convinced, as I am, that our Anglican comprehensiveness is our particular gift from God and a great blessing for the Episcopal Church in South Carolina. Follow the Anglican middle way and it will guide you between extremes in the company of Christians from all walks of life and all gifts of the Spirit. The middle way is seldom the easiest path. It is easier to walk apart, surrounded by people who look like you, and think like you, and believe like you. But if you travel the middle way, you will find the fruits of the Spirit.

As you travel along the way that God is leading the Episcopalians in South Carolina, I will pray for you and walk with you whenever I can be of service. Please call or email anytime. We are all praying for you, and we are all eager to support you on your journey.

In the words of Philips Brooks, "Pray the largest prayers. You cannot think a prayer so large that God, in answering it, will not wish you had made it larger. Pray not for crutches but for wings."

WHEREAS, certain resolutions were adopted in 2009 by prior Diocesan Conventions which altered the procedures for oath of conformity for ordinands in the Diocese; and

WHEREAS, certain amendments to the Diocesan Constitution and Canons were purportedly made in 2009, 2010, and 2011 by prior Diocesan Convention action which declared the Diocese to be "sovereign", and removed and/or limited the unqualified accession to the Constitution and Canons of The Episcopal Church; and

WHEREAS, such resolutions and amendments are in conflict with the Constitution and Canons of The Episcopal Church and should be declared null and void by this Convention.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Convention of The Episcopal Church in South Carolina affirms that all such actions purporting to modify procedures or remove accession clauses from the Diocesan Constitution and Canons are hereby declared null and void and have no legal effect, and that this Convention in its future meetings will make specific and further modifications to the Constitution and Canons of this Diocese.

Prior Amendments to the Constitution and Canons and Related Resolutions Adopted to be Declared Null and Void

### October 24, 2009 Special Diocesan Convention:

- **R-1**: Adopted a modified Oath of Conformity for ordinands in the Diocese, defining the meaning of "the substance of the 'doctrine, discipline and worship' of The Episcopal Church" that is not recognized by the Book of Common Prayer.
- R-2: Authorized the Bishop and Standing Committee to "begin withdrawing from bodies of The Episcopal Church that have assented to actions contrary to Holy Scripture, the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ." Further, it declared that Resolutions D023 and C026 adopted by General Convention 2009 are null and void.

### March 26, 2010 219th Diocesan Convention:

R-2: Voted to affirm that the Diocese of South Carolina is a "sovereign" diocese.

### October 2010 "Reconvened" Diocesan Convention: (complete language attached as adopted by Convention)

- **R-6:** Adopted a resolution that removed the diocesan accession to the Canons of TEC, and adopted first reading approval to limit accession to the Constitution of TEC, when inconsistent with or contradictory to the Diocesan Constitution and Canons.
- R-7: Resolution that removed the requirement that changes to the diocesan Constitution must only be made in "Annual" Conventions.
- **R-8** Adopted the use of the 2006 Constitution and Canons of The Episcopal Church rather than the 2009 version adopted by General Convention, currently in use.
- R-10: Adopted resolution to abolish the Dennis Canon which requires all parish and diocesan real and personal property to be held in trust by the Diocese and TEC.

R-11: Adopted a resolution that amended the Corporate Charter to remove the legal connection to TEC from the corporate purpose statement, and to declare that the Diocesan corporation will accede only to the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese.

### February 2011 220th Diocesan Convention:

- R-1: Confirmed, by second reading/final approval, the changes to the diocesan Constitution, removing accession to the TEC Constitution, except when consistent with or contradictory to the diocesan Constitution.
- R-2: Confirmed, by second reading, the removal of the requirement that constitutional changes must only be allowed in "Annual" Conventions.

## MINUTES OF THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN SOUTH CAROLINA SPECIAL CONVENTION JANUARY 26, 2013

The Special Convention was called to order at 11:46 a.m. by the Presiding Bishop, the Most Rev'd Katharine Jefferts Schori, who introduced the Rector of Grace Episcopal Church to lead the gathering in prayer. The Rev'd Canon J. Michael A. Wright asked the delegates to turn to page 15 in their bulletins from the 9:30 a.m. Diocesan Convention Choral Eucharist service, and they read aloud the Prayer for Our Diocesan Convention as reprinted from the Book of Common Prayer.

The Presiding Bishop said this day has been long awaited and that she was very grateful for the abundant presence of all those in attendance. She said we are gathered to do the work of God in this part of South Carolina.

The President Bishop then appointed the Rev'd Calhoun Walpole as Secretary of the special convention and Mr. Thomas Tisdale, Esquire, as its parliamentarian.

Mr. Tisdale read a statement concerning the convention's compliance with a court order that had been served upon representatives of the Episcopal Church of South Carolina during the past few days. Mr. Tisdale explained that as many present were aware, the Episcopal Church has been sued by a group led by our former Bishop and some others acting under his leadership. He said a South Carolina court has issued a temporary restraining order for the defendants in this lawsuit, the Episcopal Church, of which this gathering is a constituent part, like we in South Carolina are a constituent part of the United States.

Mr. Tisdale said some specifics of the order are unclear and only will be clarified after future judicial proceedings, but out of an abundance of caution, the Episcopal Church in South Carolina desires to do everything possible to comply with the court order until the courts provide further clarification. He proposed the name, the Episcopal Church in South Carolina, be used in place of and instead of what this gathering believes is its true and lawful name and that this name be used in all proceedings, written and oral. He also proposed that any other name inadvertently used in the course of these proceedings be amended accordingly. Mr. Tisdale requested a motion to this effect be made, and Mr. Lonnie Hamilton III so moved. The motion was seconded and passed overwhelmingly on a voice vote.

The Presiding Bishop then called upon the Credentials Committee to give a report on the lay delegates present.

Ms. Melinda Lucka of the committee reported that: nine parishes had 36 lay delegates; eight continuing parishes had 27 lay delegates; 10 missions had 15 lay delegates; one continuing mission had two delegates; four worshiping communities had Seat in the Convention. She reported that all lay delegates were determined to be qualified and in union with this convention.

The Rev'd Dow Sanderson reported that 20 priest delegates had voice and vote, while 15 additional priest delegates had seat and voice. He reported that all priest delegates were determined to be qualified and in union with this convention.

The Presiding Bishop declared that a quorum of priest and lay delegates exists to conduct the business of this special convention. She then asked Ms. Lucka if she had any resolutions to present.

Ms. Lucka read nine aloud nine resolutions, all of which were moved for approval, properly seconded and passed overwhelmingly on a voice vote. The resolutions included:

- 1) A resolution regarding the notice and calling of the special meeting of the convention.
- 2) A resolution to grant seat and voice.
- 3) A resolution authorizing resolutions submitted after the permitted time period.
- 4) A resolution pertaining to the dispatch of business.
- 5) A resolution for procedures for the nomination and appointment of certain offices, committees and the election of lay delegations deemed consistent with constitution and canons of the church.
- 6) A resolution declaring certain resolutions, constitutional and canonical changes null and void. The resolution also contained an exhibit of prior amendments and canons to be declared null and void, and this Exhibit R-6 was provided to the delegates. This was the only resolution in which there was any discussion. The Rev'd Marshall Huey, a visiting clergy, asked how this would pertain to the Dennis Canon, the October 2010 repeal of which was among the changes that this resolution would declare null and void. The Presiding Bishop replied that all parishes remaining in the Episcopal Church would have to follow all its canons, including the Dennis Canon.
- 7) A resolution regarding all offices elected or appointed at the special meeting of the convention deemed to begin at the annual convention on March 8, 2013.
- 8) A resolution dedicating the offering from the day's Holy Eucharist to Episcopal Relief and Development.

The Presiding Bishop then called on Mr. Hillary P. Douglas, chair of the Steering Committee for the Reorganization of the Episcopal Church in South Carolina, to provide the report on the Committee for the Selection of a Provisional Bishop. Mr. Douglas nominated the Right Rev'd Charles Glenn vonRosenberg, former Third Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of East Tennessee. The delegates and visitors greeted his nomination with a standing ovation.

The Presiding Bishop said unless there are any other nominations, she believes the election has been made by acclamation. She asked those present to follow in their bulletins the service for the Investiture of a Provisional Bishop. The Rev'd Wright invited all priests to come forward. The service proceeded as outlined in the bulletin, with the people affirming their recognition and reception of the Right Rev'd vonRosenberg as their bishop and their vow to uphold him in this ministry. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg promised to observe, and to the utmost of his power fulfill, the office's responsibilities and obligations.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg then addressed the convention. On behalf of the diocese, he expressed thanks to the Most Rev'd Jefferts Schori, as well as to those who have worked hard to prepare for this day, including Mr. Tisdale and Mr. Douglas, and clergy, staff and laity of Grace Episcopal Church. He also thanked clergy and others throughout the diocese for persevering to reclaim their heritage in less than ideal circumstances. He said we have quite a task ahead of us, but with each other's support and God's grace, we will be successful. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg also thanked his wife, Annie.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg said as we consider the building blocks needed for rebuilding the diocese, it first is important to think about the foundation upon which we will build. He said Jesus Christ is that foundation, particularly the two Christly virtues of humility and love. He said that splits within the church dated back to the time of the Apostles, so there is no room for self-righteousness. He said we must recognize that other sincere Christians, former Episcopalians, have chosen a different path, even though our intentions mirror one another. Therefore it is appropriate to pray for each other and wish each other well on our separate ways.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg outlined four building blocks that will help rebuild. First, is the realization that we are not alone but part of the Episcopal Church and the worldwide Anglican communion. Second, the tent that covers the Episcopal Church is wide and broad, and all may seek shelter under it. The tent covers a family, and its family members do not agree always. Third, the diocese will continue to emphasize classic, Episcopal theology, a rich

heritage based on scripture, tradition and reason. Fourth, and most important, is an emphasis on mission. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg said we must take care not to focus too much on ourselves going forward but on the needs of the wider community. He said the church is the only society that exists for the benefit of nonmembers.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg concluded by saying we have a lot of work to do rebuilding the church in South Carolina, and he concluded with words from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ may give to you a spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope of His calling.

Mr. Tisdale then presented the Right Rev'd vonRosenberg with a gavel, and he then called upon the Rev'd Gay Clark Jennings, president of the Episcopal Church House of Deputies. Rev'd Clark Jennings said that the House of Deputies and the entire church are covering the Episcopal Church with prayer as we seek to rebuild. She said faithful Episcopalians in South Carolina will need everyone's gifts to create a new church for a new time, and she encouraged the convention to follow the Anglican middle way, which is not always the easiest path but the one where the fruits of the spirit are found. She encouraged the church to pray the largest prayers, for no one can think of a prayer so large that God, in answering it, will not wish that it had been larger.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg then called upon Angela Daniel, President of Province IV (the Diocese of Upper South Carolina). Ms. Daniel echoed the words of the Interim Bishop and said the convention is not alone. She said we cannot begin to image the number of people who are not present in this place but who are offering prayers on our behalf. She said if we pray that we all remain together in our love for our Lord and Savior, we are praying for us all.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg made an announcement that he said might be among his most popular as Bishop, that it was time for lunch. The convention recessed for lunch at 12:48 p.m.

The convention reconvened at 1:45 p.m. by singing the hymn, "Joyful Joyful We Adore Thee."

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg then called upon Ms. Kathleen Wells, chancellor of the Continuing Dioceses of Fort Worth, who offered greetings from rebuilding diocese in San Joaquin, Virginia, Pittsburg and Fort Worth. Ms. Wells encouraged everyone to remember the joy they see here today, and she said it was lovely for her diocese in Fort Worth to get its own fresh, positive start. She offered her diocese's help going forward.

Mr. Tisdale said the main purpose of this special convention, in addition is to electing an interim Bishop, is to reestablish the ecclesiastical authority for this diocese. He noted there are several offices that must be filled at the church's annual convention on March 8 and 9, 2013, and while there would be some elections on this day, they would not cover all those offices.

Mr. Tisdale then asked Mr. Douglas to come forward and make two nominations. Mr. Tisdale noted that Mr. Douglas has chaired the steering committee for the Episcopal Church in South Carolina and has done an outstanding job.

Mr. Douglas nominated the Rev'd Walpole as Secretary for the Convention. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg asked if there were any other nominations. There were none, and a motion to close nominations and elect the Rev'd Walpole was made, seconded and approved.

Mr. Douglas then nominated the Rev'd James E. Taylor as Treasurer of the Diocese. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg asked if there were any other nominations. There were none, and a motion to close nominations and elect the Rev'd Taylor was made, seconded and approved.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg then nominated Mr. Tisdale as Chancellor of the Diocese, and his nomination was duly moved, seconded and approved. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg thanked Mr. Tisdale for his long and hard work and devoted service to get the church to the point where it is. The convention applauded.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg then appointed Mr. Scott Howell as Historiographer of the Diocese and thanked him for his service. He then called on The Nominating Committee for nominations for membership in the Standing Committee.

Mr. Tisdale said the committee has recommended one person for each position on the Standing Committee, which includes six clergy members and six lay members in staggered terms. He told delegates they would receive ballots for the election of these members, and write-in votes would be counted. Mr. Tisdale then read the nominations, including the following clergy nominees: The Rev'd Richard Lindsey and The Rev'd David Williams (one-year terms); The Rev'd Colton Smith and The Rev'd Canon J. Michael A. Wright (two-year terms); The Rev'd Wilmot T. Merchant, II and the Rev'd Calhoun Walpole (three-year terms). Mr. Tisdale then read the lay member nominees: Virginia C. Wilder and Melinda Lucka (one-year terms); Hillery P. Douglas and Rebecca Lovelace (two-year terms); and Erin Elizabeth Bailey and Lonnie Hamilton III (three-year terms). A motion to close the nominations was made, seconded and affirmed. Mr. Tisdale said the Standing Committee elections could not be done by acclamation, and ballots were distributed.

Mr. Tisdale said the convention also would elect six clergy and six lay members to three-year terms on the Diocesan Council. He said the clergy nominated include: The Rev'd Mark Brinkmann; The Rev'd Roy Hills; The Rev. Wil Keith; The Rev'd Jeff Richardson; The Rev'd John Zahl; and The Rev'd George Tompkins. He then said the lay members nominated include: Nancy Bailey, Holly Behre, Alesia Rico Flores, Mary Ann Foy, Charles Geer, MD, and Barbara Mann. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg asked if there were other nominations, and after none was made, there was a motions to close nominations and elect these 12 by acclamation. The motion was approved.

The convention then considered nominees for Trustees of the University of the South. Mr. Tisdale said these nominees include the Rev'd Canon J. Michael A. Wright for a three-year term; Ms. Ann Stirling for a two-year term; and Mr. Robert Ray Black for a one-year term. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg asked if there were any other nominations for Suwanee Trustees, and there were none. A motion to elect these three by acclamation was made, seconded and approved. Mr. Tisdale told the delegates they had done a great service by giving the church the officers it needs to begin the long and joyful work of reorganizing the diocese.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg then called upon the Treasurer for a report. The Rev'd Taylor said where one's treasure is, their heart is also, and he has seen many of our hearts and they are large. He said this work does not stop and the church will continue to need members' time, talent and treasurer in the future. He encouraged those present to stay attuned to the website to learn how to send along contributions as needed.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg then called for the report of the Convention Committee, which was made by the Rev'd Richard Lindsey. The Rev'd Lindsey said this convention has been blessed by many who have committed their time, talent and enthusiasm. He thanked the Rector of Grace Church and others with the church for hosting this historic convention, and those present gave them a round of applause. He also thanked the Bishop Gadsden retirement community for hosting the previous night's reception for the Presiding Bishop. The Rev'd Lindsey reminded the convention that the Episcopal Church in South Carolina will gather again at Grace Church in only six weeks. He called the day's convention a blessing to cherish and remember.

Mr. Tisdale reported that all 12 of those nominated for positions on the Standing Committee have been elected.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg then called on the Secretary, the Rev'd Calhoun Walpole, who announced all present are invited to a service at 5:30 p.m. on February 12, 2013 at St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Denmark. She

said The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg will preach and the Rev'd Wilmot T. Merchant II would serve as the Celebrant at this annual Absalom Jones Feast Day celebration.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg said he would ask the Chancellor, Mr. Tom Tisdale, to form a committee for updating the diocesan canons, and he asked all those elected to the Standing Committee to gather at the chancel steps immediately after the convention adjourns. He then asked if there were any other business to come before the convention, and there was only one minor one. Priests who borrowed a white stole were asked to remember to drop it off.

Ms. Lucka then presented several courtesy resolutions, thanking many people for their gifts of time, thought and resources for this historic moment. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg asked her to read all the names and then the convention would vote on them as one.

The resolutions thanked: the Most Rev'd Katharine Jefferts Schori; President of the Episcopal Church House of Deputies Rev. Gay Clark Jennings; The Right Rev'd John C. Buchanan; The Right Rev'd Roger S. Harris; The Right Rev'd Robert H. Johnson; The Right Rev'd Dabney T. Smith; The Right Rev'd W. Andrew Waldo; The Right Rev'd George D. Young III; The Right Rev'd Dorsey F. Henderson, Jr.; The Right Rev'd Henry I. Louittit, Jr.; President of Province IV, Angela Daniel; Treasurer of Province IV, Barbara G. Mann; Diocese of Forth Worth Chancellor Kathleen Wells; and The Rev. George I. Chassey.

The resolutions also thanked: The Rev'd Canon J. Michael A. Wright and Grace Church's clergy and staff; Grace's St. Gregory, St. Cecilia and St. Nicholas Junior choirs; the youth present; supporting dioceses, including the Standing Committee of the Diocese of Virginia, The Right Rev'd Rayford B. High, provisional bishop of the Diocese of Forth Worth; Fort Worth Diocese Standing Committee President Martha Fagley, and the Standing Committee of the Diocese of San Joaquin; to the Steering Committee for the Reorganization of the Episcopal Church in South Carolina, including Mr. Hillery P. Douglas and other advisors; the Rev'd Rick Lindsey, Dr. Charles Geer and all members of the All Saints Hilton Head mission team currently in the Dominican Republic; to the many faithful Episcopalians in this Diocese who have remained loyal to the church. The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg asked the delegates to vote as they stand, and all stood.

The Right Rev'd vonRosenberg adjourned the convention with a prayer at 2:28 p.m.
