<b>CPG Insurance &amp; Pension</b> Key things all churches should know about CPG insurance and pension. Whether searching for part-time or full-time clergy, have a church staff less than four people, or are managing a staff of 15 – get the critical information you need to know about timelines, eligibility, enrollment, diocesan health plan and group life, pension and more.	<b>Vestry/Mission Council 101 Roles, Responsibilities, and Best Practices</b> Learn how to move your vestry from a focus on day-to-day management or crisis response to a more effective form of leadership. Designed for clergy, wardens, and vestry members, this workshop will explore the role of the vestry in selecting new leadership, orienting new members, planning and evaluation, and supporting staff and disciples.	<b>Creating and Leading Adult Studies</b> Find and share resources for adult programs as well as get tips for leading successful studies. Resources shared will include Sunday School, Bible Study, Education for Ministry and ChurchNext, an online resource.	<b>Outreach Ministries and Best Practices</b> St. Stephens, North Myrtle Beach will share their experience with outreach ministries. They have a culture, energy and commitment to serving their community. Find out how you can use this model in your own church and share what ministries you are doing.
<b>Records management</b> Get up to speed on records management – what you should be tracking for your church operations. From canonical requirements to common sense info that will help in later reports – what to record, where and how? We will also address safeguarding, background checks, EM and EV licensing and parochial reports.	<b>Budgeting with the “Five Marks of Mission”</b> How do you keep the mission of the church in mind throughout the budgeting process? Learn how the Five Marks of Mission can guide your approach to creating and revising your church budget. Get caught up in the numbers, but also the purpose that your budget areas seek to address.	<b>Youth Ministry</b> Transformed Student ministries: a relational model of youth ministry based on simple aspects of Jesus ministry with His own disciples. There are more demands on a teenager’s life than ever before. What is needed is not fancy or flashy but simple relationships in all aspects of their lives.	<b>Mining Leadership Gifts in Your Congregation</b> Learn ways to recruit members to be active in all church ministries by matching individual gifts with your church’s needs. We will discuss ways to encourage participation and share ideas and practices from your own congregation.
<b>Communication I: What’s The Plan?</b> Let’s look at the year ahead and learn about resources to help you create a communication calendar for 2016-2017. Bring your long-range calendar with you!	<b>KISS—Keeping it Simple with Stewardship</b> It’s not just about your Fall appeal. Stewardship is a year-round process. Join us to learn basic techniques and share and discuss what has worked for others. Topics will include resources available through the diocese, the Episcopal Church Foundation, and more.	<b>5 Simple Steps to Bring Your Family Closer to God and Each Other</b> Why do parents sometimes feel ill-equipped to be spiritual leaders for their families? Because we usually over-think it. It’s not rocket science, but it does have to do with recognized neuropsychological principles that everyone can use – grandparents, children and parents – in guiding and enriching one another’s lives in Christ.	<b>Music and Liturgy</b> We all have different resources to use in our worship. Join us to discuss how to maximize the potential of your music and service, and utilize your resources in a liturgically appropriate manner. This panel discussion will share new ideas and best practices.
<b>Communication II: The Digital Bucket List</b> What are the must-have items for any church in the digital age? A basic website and email newsletter. If you don’t have these, you will when you leave this workshop. And if you already do, then let’s run a quick check-up to see how we can get them working even better.	<b>Planned Giving Basics</b> Is God’s will in the wills of your congregation members? Is it on your radar? Are you talking about Planned Giving in your congregation? Are you missing out on money to support your mission? Come learn Planned Giving basics— from marketing, to best practices if you have it, and how to start, if you don’t.	<b>Q&amp;A with the Bishop</b> Bishop Charles vonRosenberg will be available for an open discussion about our diocese. This is a great time to speak with the Bishop before he retires July 1.	<b>Missions Discussion</b> A facilitated open discussion for all leaders of missions, historical and new. It is a time to ask each other questions about best practices and stumbling blocks you have had.
