





Are we volunteers or ministers? In recent years, Episcopal congregations have emphasized the importance of ministry of all the baptized. But this emphasis is really nothing new; it is the essence of the Church!

In fact, ordained ministry flows from our understanding of the role of ministry of the laity – ministry both within and beyond the parish.

This interactive workshop will explore the emerging role of the laity within TEC today.

We will discuss how the local parish, in partnership with the diocese, can intentionally affirm, support and equip its members for ministry. And, we will explore how this emphasis leads to improved congregational vitality and growth.

Many Episcopal congregations today that were not long ago growing and energetic have become complacent and “stuck on coast mode.” Yet, others are vibrant, fruitful, and conspicuously relevant to their respective communities. How and why does that happen?

We will review current congregational vitality characteristics and good practices. And we will explore the need for transformative lay and clergy leadership within the local parish today.
